What is PIT and HIC?

Point-in-Time (PIT)

- Count of all sheltered and unsheltered homeless people in your community on a single night
- Occurs in the last 10 days of January annually.

Housing Inventory Count

- Inventory and capacity information of all programs that provide beds and units <u>dedicated</u> to serving people experiencing homelessness.
- Performed on the same night of PIT.
- Captures inventory information for the following project types:
 - Emergency Shelter (ES)
 - Transitional Housing (TH)
 - Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
 - Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)
 - Other Permanent Housing (OPH)

Purpose of PIT and HIC

PIT

- Determines program and funding need for local communities.
- Develop our community score.
- Identify accuracy and completeness of our community effort.

HIC

- Helps the local CoC to review three things:
 - Utilization
 - Gaps
 - Context

2023 PIT RECAP

What did we learn?

2023 PIT Recap: What did we learn?

- Survey included only mandatory questions and gave the option to refuse to answer.
- Local CoC removed the Social Security Number from PIT survey.
- Pro: may have increased participation for those surveyed
- <u>Con</u>: increased difficulty to de-duplicate when demographic information was refused.

Added Support by Government & Volunteer Co-Coordinator

- Support by the City of Pensacola and Escambia County for PIT and You-Count.
- Support by BRACE as Volunteer Co-Coordinator.
- Increased notification to encampments and known locations to bring awareness amongst our unhoused neighbors.
- Increased mapping overlay to identify encampments.
- Increased volunteer participation at You-Count.
- Coordinated de-duplication process and transportation with wristbands for ECAT.

Added Street Outreach Teams

- Extended number of survey days.
- Added routes.
- Night-time count for the first time ever.
- Extension of routes increased number of contacts.
- Additional routes expanded reach further across the CoC coverage area (Century, Cantonment, rural-Santa Rosa, and Navarre/Gulf Breeze)


Real-time PIT Data

- The Opening Doors HMIS team added real-time PIT data to the website.
- Pro: Instant notification to public of progress.

Volunteer Appreciation

- First-ever volunteer appreciation event post-PIT.
- Hosted by Family Promise of Escambia and BRACE.

Projections for 2024 Data Collection

- Race and Ethnicity has been combined for 2024.
- Expectations by HUD, VA, and HHS
 - Improve reach to engage and accurately count the following subpopulations:
 - Youth
 - Veterans
 - Domestic Violence
 - Chronically Homeless
 - Increase inventory
 - Increase utilization (must be 85% on night of PIT / HIC for all project types)

Night of PIT

When?

• The night of PIT is January 22, 2024.

PIT and HIC Process

Conduct the Sheltered Count

- Count people in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing programs for the night of PIT.
 - All programs regardless of funding will be recorded.
 - Includes Temporary emergency hotel/motel vouchers for homeless people paid by a nonprofit.

Data Collection

- We will use a combination of:
 - Hyperion: Web-based (this is not an app)
 - Paper survey designed by Lead Agency
 - HMIS

PIT for HMIS-Participating Agencies

- Provider must ensure all clients in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing Program are enrolled for the night of PIT.
- For New Program Participants on the night of PIT:
 - Complete the Universal Data Elements and Program Specific Data Elements for your project
- For New and Ongoing Program Participants on the night of PIT:
 - Record a PIT Service Transaction: Census Data
- Ensure clients that have left the program are exited out before the night of PIT so that they are not counted.

PIT for Non-HMIS Participating Agencies

- Collect surveys via Hyperion or paper
- HMIS Lead will create a Non-CHO project in HMIS with a custom PIT survey
- HMIS Lead will port data from Hyperion or paper survey into the Non-CHO project to run custom report.

Housing Inventory Count Process

- Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing HIC will be based on the number of heads in beds on the PIT. Inventory in HMIS must match the number of people enrolled.
- For Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing projects
- 1. Enter the following for Category 1 Homeless program participants on the night of PIT:
 - Service Transaction: Census Data
 - This will flag the individuals who are homeless.
- 2. For Housed Program Participants:
 - Ensure all program participants housed Housing Move-In Dates for housed clients are entered in HMIS on an interim update.
